- **Dangerous Offenders and Long-Term Offender Procedure** According to British Columbia's Court of Appeal, the defendant continues to enjoy the right to silence in a dangerous offender proceeding while a refusal to participate in a court ordered assessment may result in a court finding a defence-ordered assessment to have been undermined, it may not use the defendant's silence to draw inferences in support of the prosecution's theories: *R. v. Clayton*, 2023 BCCA 33, 2023 CarswellBC 175 (B.C. C.A.).
- Exclusion, Absconding or Absence from the Court Room The Court of Appeal for Ontario held that the accused's right conferred by s. 650 of the *Criminal Code* to attend the entirety of his or her trial includes the right to attend the pre-trial application for the production of third-party records: *R. v. M.C.*, 2023 CarswellOnt 14540, 2023 ONCA 611 (Ont. C.A.).
