Highlights

- Selected Legislation Ontario Ontario Not-for-Profit Corporations Act Guides - Not-for-Profit Corporations Act, 2010 – Transition Considerations – The Act came into force on October 19, 2021. Provincially incorporated not-for-profit corporations will need to inform or remind themselves of their new requirements under ONCA. The letters patent of a not-for-profit corporation incorporated under the *Corporations Act* will become its articles under ONCA; however, a corporation will be required to update both its articles and by-laws, as necessary, to comply with ONCA. Though many of ONCA's provisions do take effect on October 19, 2021, the statute includes as three-year transition period to allow corporations time to update their articles and by-laws.
- Selected Legislation Ontario Ontario Not-for-Profit Corporations Act Guides – Ontario Business Registry – On October 19, 2021, the Ontario Business Registry came into effect. OBR is an online system which will allow Ontario businesses, including not-for-profit corporations, to file forms and notices using OBR's website, rather than having to visit Service Ontario in person or mail documents to the Ministry of Government and Consumer Services. For example, users can access OBR to incorporate an Ontario not-for-profit corporation. The filings will be instantaneous, with users receiving transaction receipts by email. In addition, businesses may use OBR to receive automatic email reminders of upcoming filings deadlines.
