Highlights

The 2022 supplement contains coverage of significant recent developments in products liability law, including:

- *Lemmon v. Snap, Inc.* (9th Cir.; social media company, whose smartphone application allegedly prompted decedents to travel at high rates of speed in vehicle, was not entitled to immunity under federal law on negligent design claim) (§ 4:32)
- *Amazon.com, Incorporated v. McMillan* (5th Cir.; online marketplace operator was not “seller” under Texas law of third party-product sold on its website) (§ 7:3)
- *Feasel v. Tracker Marine LLC* (Supreme Court of Utah; providing warnings only to the purchaser is not always sufficient to relieve the supplier from liability) (§ 11:9)
- References to recent articles in law reviews and other publications.

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
