Highlights

Highlights to this update include discussion of:

- *United States v. Lewis*, 125 F.4th 69 (2nd Cir. 2025), involving conditions of supervised release requiring the provision of financial information upon request (§ 8:16)
- *United States v. Acevedo-Osorio*, 118 F.4th 117 (1st Cir. 2024), where the court upheld a prohibition against unsupervised contact with the defendant's own children, as a condition of supervised release (§ 9:8)
- *United States v. Vaughn*, 119 F.4th 1084 (6th Cir. 2024), wherein the district court did not improperly delegate its judicial authority by imposing special condition of supervised release (§ 22:51)
- *United States v. Turner*, 124 F.4th 69 (1st Cir. 2024), discussing that in the context of supervised release revocation, the court has discretion to impose concurrent or consecutive sentences (§ 27:23)
