- Liability of vehicle host for injury to occupant, status of occupant as guest or passenger, host liability for injury to vehicle occupant, and duties of vehicle occupants; and
- Liability for injury at railroad crossings..

- Liability for injury due to roadway conditions, including governmental duties/liabilities for conditions, precautions by and notice to government of condition, roadway conditions as proximate cause of injury or damage, negligence of motorist/passenger as related to roadway conditions, and liability for injury to person and property away from roadway;
- Liability of common carrier for injury to passenger; and
- Duties in the carriage of goo
