

What's New in this 2022–2023 Supplement

The 2022–2023 supplement includes updates and coverage on the following topics:

- Supreme Court decision striking down New York State's "proper cause" gun license statute as a violation of the Second Amendment.
- The fate of concealed-carry licenses and statutes criminalizing the carrying of an unlicensed weapon.
- Constitutional limits on gun control legislation generally.
- Supreme Court overturning of *Roe v. Wade*, and the fate of statutes criminalizing abortion in the wake of this monumental change to the Supreme Court's jurisprudence regarding substantive due process.
- California's legislative abrogation of the felony-murder doctrine by requiring that a jury find malice as an element beyond a reasonable doubt rather than having malice imputed simply by virtue of participation in a triggering felony.
- The retroactive nature of California's repeal of felony murder, including the procedural mechanics for challenging prior convictions under the old scheme.
- California's elimination of the natural and probable consequences doctrine for accomplice liability.
- The distinction between poison as a separate offense and poisoning as assault.
- Admissibility of expert evidence regarding Battered Spouse Syndrome.
- Florida's Stand Your Ground statute, including the process for asserting pretrial immunity from prosecution.
- New caselaw on obstructing a governmental proceeding, insurrection, sedition, and seditious conspiracy.
