After a brief stint in private practice in Shreveport and military service, he joined the law faculty at Louisiana State University in 1972 and was a full-time member of that faculty until 1984, achieving the rank of full professor in 1978. In his student days, he had the privilege of being the student of the legendary Boyd Professor Wex S. Malone. Then, in his early faculty years, Professor Malone asked him to assist in the writing of the Second Edition of *Louisiana Workers' Compensation Law and Practice*—a two-year process that established a strong personal and professional bond between them that lasted until Professor Malone's death in 1988.

After 1984, Professor Johnson continued to serve as an adjunct professor at the Hebert Law Center, Louisiana State University, teaching a variety of subjects. In the spring semester of 2012, he returned to full-time status on the faculty for three semesters. On June 1, 2013, he reverted to his prior adjunct status for a few years, and maintains a professional relationship with Phelps Dunbar.

In 1984, he left the full-time faculty to open the Baton Rouge branch office of Phelps Dunbar, the first in its 130-year history at that time. By 2025, the office has grown to over fifty attorneys and remains the largest branch office of Phelps Dunbar. He is a fellow of the American Academy of Appellate Lawyers and received the Louisiana Bar Foundation's Distinguished Attorney Award in 2005 along with the Louisiana State Bar Association's Boisfontaine Trial Advocacy Award in that same year.
