Highlights

- **Test for the correction of records** — This is the first decision to consider the correction provisions of the CYFSA, ss. 315(1), (9) and (11) — The complainant must demonstrate to the service provider’s satisfaction that the record is inaccurate or incomplete and provide the necessary information to correct the record, however, even then the service provider may not be compelled to correct the record if the record was not created by the service provider and the service provider does not have sufficient knowledge to make the correction or the record contains a professional opinion or observation made in good faith: *Durham Children’s Aid Society, Re*, 2024 CarswellOnt 7202 (Ont. Information & Privacy Comm.).
- **Production of Records** — The B.C. Court of Appeal has held that the public interest in disclosure of records held by a public body does not override solicitor/client privilege under FIPPA: *British Columbia (Children and Family Development) v. British Columbia (Information and Privacy Commissioner)*, 2024 BCCA 190 (B.C. C.A.).
