2026 Annual Upkeep

Enclosed is your 2026 Annual Upkeep for the units of Federal Practice and Procedure (FPP) that relate to the Civil Rules, Jurisdiction & Related Matters, the Evidence Rules, and Judicial Review of Administrative Action. This upkeep replaces the 2025 updates for Volumes 4 to 33A (issued April 2025) and should be received in two packages.

If you also subscribe to the Criminal unit of FPP (comprising Volumes 1 to 3D), please consult the separate filing instructions accompanying the 2026 upkeep to that unit.

Highlights

Having been cited by courts thousands of times in published opinion, FPP is far and away the primary authority on federal practice for both judges and lawyers. “Federal Practice and Procedure is cited so often in part because it deals with procedure, and every litigated case potentially raises procedural issues. But the work is also cited so often because its persuasive authority is accepted, and because its explanations of complicated matters are so lucid.” 32 Tex. Int’l L.J. 367. This 2026 Upkeep continues to deliver clear, timely, and insightful analysis of the latest statutory, rule-based, and case law developments affecting the civil practitioner.

This year’s upkeep includes: coverage of recent court decisions throughout each unit of the Treatise; new and revised sections in volumes 4, 6A, 11A, 15C, 21B, 30B and 33; and coverage of the 2025 amendments to the Federal Rules of Civil Procedure and Appellate Procedure, including new Civil Rule 16.1 (Multidistrict Litigation).

Stay current throughout the year: The SUPPLEMENTAL SERVICE is provided in monthly cumulative installments to alert Federal Practice and Procedure users to the latest reported case law, legislation, rule amendments, journal articles, and other substantive developments affecting federal litigation. With the publication of the enclosed 2026 Supplements to your hardbound volumes, the Supplemental Service will now start a new annual cycle.

Federal Practice Deskbook (Volume 20): Described as “the best one-volume treatment on the law and practice of the federal courts that exists,” this volume is designed to act as a portable abridged version of the larger set, allowing ready access to its analysis from your briefcase or desk. This year’s upkeep includes revisions to sections concerning universal injunctions (§ 13), civil rights cases (§ 24), diversity jurisdiction (§ 33) and pretrial conferences (§ 97).

Filing Instructions

2026 Supplements for Hardbound Volumes: New cumulative pocket parts have been prepared for volumes 4 to 5B, 6 to 9, 9B to 13, 13C, 13E, 13F, 14B to 15B, 16 to 23, and 25 to 33. New cumulative softbound pamphlets update volumes 9A, 13A, 13B, 13D, 14, 14A, 15C, 23A, and 24. These 2026 pocket parts/pamphlets should be placed with their respective bound volumes, and your 2025 pocket parts/pamphlets should be recycled.

There is no new upkeep for volume 5C, which was recently revised and replaced with a new edition. This shipment contains a generic insert, which should be placed into the back pocket of that volume as a reminder.

Replacement Appendix Pamphlets: Three new appendix pamphlets, denominated Volumes 12A, 19A, and 33A, have been prepared. Replace your 2025 Editions of these pamphlets with the provided 2026 Editions.

Replacement Quick Reference Guide Pamphlets: New Quick Reference Guides have also been prepared for the Civil and Evidence Rules. These pamphlets are denominated Volumes 12B (Civil) and 31A (Evidence). Again, replace your 2025 Editions of these pamphlets with the provided 2026 Editions.

General Index and Tables Pamphlet: Replace the 2025 Edition of your General Index and Tables pamphlet with the provided 2026 Edition.

Reminder: A table is published immediately after the Table of Contents in each issue of the Supplemental Service. It identifies precisely what your library should contain and is updated throughout the year to reflect FPP's current components.
